What is The Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is government money designed to help students who are currently registered for Free School Meals, or who have been registered for Free School Meals within the last 6 years, to do well at school. The children of Armed Forces families, and young people who are In Care are also eligible for Pupil Premium funding.

How much Pupil Premium money does our school receive?

For the period April 2017 to March 2018, we received £16,830.
